#### The Mae Trio - CASTLEMAINE CREATED

Possessing a grace beyond their years, The Mae Trio are the combined talents of three young award-winning musicians fast making a name for themselves in the world of contemporary folk. Together with Anita Hillman, local sisters Maggie and Elsie Rigby write strikingly insightful original songs which they sing in exquisite harmony.

Creating driving rhythms on banjo, ukulele, cello and bass, evocative violin/cello duet arrangements and the haunting sound of concert marimba, The Mae Trio's songs are poetic and melodic.

From the lament for a lost banjo to a lyrical tribute to William Morris, this trio is fresh off the blocks with disarming charm in their song delivery, and utterly lovely.

Maggie and Elsie won the prestigious Lis Johnston Memorial Award for Vocal Excellence at the National Folk Festival 2011. Anita has performed with the successful folk band Evelyn's Secret, and with the Melbourne Scottish Fiddle Club.

#### Ludovico's Band

First formed in 2002, Ludovico's Band emerged from the desire to create a predominately plucked basso continuo band, whilst highlighting the solo repertoire of early plucked instruments. Taking their name from the influential 16th century Spanish harpist, the band is acclaimed for its performances of music from the 16th to the 18th centuries.

Ludovico's Band is one of Australia's most dynamic baroque bands. The music of John Dowland (1563–1626) and Henry Purcell (1659–1695), two of the greatest English musicians of all time, will form part of the program for this unmissable concert. Dowland's and Purcell's profound insights into the human soul, with Dowland expressing a deeply melancholic view of life and Purcell a rich theatrical extravagance, helped to create songs and music from an astonishing era.

Ludovico's Band will bring the timeless quality of this extraordinary music to life in this concert. They will also celebrate the marvelous musical awakening of 17th century England through John Dryden's Fairest Isle, with music of exquisite beauty and refinement.
